Registration Procedures

- 1. Remove all holds which will prevent your registration (Business Office, Advisor Approval, etc).
- 2. In consultation with your academic advisor, plan your schedule and register for classes via Trojan Web Express.
- 3. If you are unable to register on Trojan Web Express, return the completed Registration Form, signed by your advisor, to 119 Malone Hall.
- 4. Go to the switchboard in Malone Hall for a parking decal and Student ID.
- 5. Check with the Student Financial Services/Financial Aid Office regarding your balance.

Visit the Admissions Office if you are a new student (not admitted), a returning student who has been out 1 or more years, a returning student who has attended another institution, or a returning student who has already graduated from Troy University.

Online Registration

- From the Students Menu in Trojan Web Express, select Student Self-Service and then select Student Planning.
- 2. In the Course Catalog you can begin by selecting a discipline or entering the department in the search box. To search for a course you must type the name of the department, not the abbreviation (ex. Mathematics, not MTH). On the left-hand side of the screen, you can also filter the courses currently being offered by specifying location and term*.
- Once you find a course you would like to register for, click on View Available Sections and then click Add Section to Schedule.
- 4. In the pop-up, click **Add Section to Schedule** to add the course. *Leave the Grading selection* as Graded unless you plan to Audit the course.
- 5. Go to your Schedule under **Plan & Schedule**. Use the arrows to toggle to the correct semester/term. The course will be yellow since you are not registered for this course

and section. To register for the course, click **Register Now** on the planned course. Once registered, the course will appear green and will indicate that you are registered. You may drop your class(es) by clicking **Drop** and selecting the desired class(es). In order to withdraw (drop all classes), you must contact the Records Office.

*Select location D01 (Dothan), D02 (Ft. Rucker), T05 (BSN) for 16-week nursing courses, or TIP (Internship/Practicum) for 16-week internship/practicum classes. Contact your advisor if you are unable to register for your classes online.

You will not be able to register for a course that has a prerequisite that has not been completed or if there is a hold on your account.

Tuition & Fees

It is your responsibility to ensure that all tuition and fees are paid by the posted due date. Financial aid must be GUARANTEED for the student to be classified as a financial aid recipient. If financial aid is not guaranteed, payment will be due by the dates listed above. Financial aid recipients are responsible for the balance of tuition and fees not paid by their award. Any student who registers for classes will be responsible for tuition and fees regardless of class attendance. Tuition and fees can be paid online via Trojan Web Express; however, you may also pay at the Student Financial Services Office, 118 Malone Hall.

After 90 days, all unpaid accounts will be turned over to a collection agency. The collection agency will assess a collection fee at the time they receive these accounts. <u>If your account is placed with a collection agency.</u> <u>YOU will be responsible for collection fees, up to 33.33%, in addition to the outstanding balance.</u>

Withdrawal Policy

Withdrawal from the University is defined as resigning from all courses for all current semester or term classes.

From beginning of registration through last day to drop/add

Students who wish to withdraw from all classes prior to the last day to drop/add must CANCEL their registration in writing through the designated withdrawal official (DWO). Written cancellation does not require the completion of the withdrawal form or an exit interview. Tuition and refundable fees will be returned.

From last day to drop/add through the last day to withdraw

A student who wishes to withdraw from all courses for a current semester or term may withdraw with no academic penalty with a non-punitive grade of "W" until the last day to withdraw (posted in the Schedule of Classes and on appropriate web pages). Tuition and fees will be charged during this period.

The last day to withdraw from a semester or term will be assigned based on approximately 65% completion of the length of the course. The last day to withdraw for a semester will be Friday of the 10th week. The 65% date for special formatted terms and sessions will be posted as appropriate for those particular courses.

Students may access the withdrawal form at http://
troy.edu/records/forms.html. An official withdrawal
form must be completed and processed before the
student's withdrawal is considered final. **Students**may not withdraw after the withdrawal deadline.
Any student who fails to withdraw by the deadline
will be assigned a grade. *Extenuating circumstances*must be properly documented. Note: Withdrawal
deadlines for Financial Aid may be calculated
differently.

Withdrawal Policy

Course Eligibility

Only courses required for your degree will be eligible for Financial Aid /Veterans' Financial Assistance. If any course is not properly assigned on your evaluation, request an official program evaluation from the Records Office.

Satisfactory Academic Progress

The United States Department of Education requires that all students meet satisfactory academic progress to receive federal financial aid.

Dropping

If you drop a course(s), your financial aid may be canceled or reduced from funds already disbursed. You should contact the Office of Financial Aid to determine the financial impact for your specific situation. There is a \$30 per course drop processing fee charged after the Last Day for Free Schedule Adjustment.

Withdrawing

If you withdraw before 60% of the term is completed, federal regulations require the University to return a prorated amount of your Pell Grant and/or Stafford Loan to the appropriate federal account. The Office of Student Financial Services will bill the student for the amount returned. There is a \$50 withdrawal processing fee (regardless of the number of courses) charged after Last Day for Free Schedule Adjustment.

Failure to Attend

Class attendance is required for all students to establish eligibility for receiving financial aid. Students receiving the grade of "FA" for a course(s) could have their financial aid canceled or reduced. The Office of Student Financial Services will bill the student for the amount canceled or reduced.

Refund Policy

Any student who registers for classes will be responsible for tuition and fees regardless of class attendance. Refunds to financial aid students are not made until after the financial aid funds have been received by the University. Fees are non-refundable. Tuition refunds will be granted according to the following schedule:

Student Refunds/Higher One

To receive any refunds from the University, a student must activate his or her refund preference with Higher One. First, check the mail for your Refund Selection Kit, arriving in a bright green envelope. This will be sent to the address that you have on file with the University. Once it arrives, simply follow these steps to make your refund preference selection:

- 1. Visit TrojanOneCard.com
- 2. Enter your Personal Code (Found in your Refund Selection Kit)
- 3. Select how you'd like to receive your money

Parking Decal & Student ID

Parking permits are available at the switchboard in Malone Hall. University Parking Regulations <u>require</u> all students to register their vehicle with the University. To be valid, the permit must be mounted (taping is not permitted) in the lower left corner of the vehicle's rear glass. Any student driving or parking on campus without a permit will be in violation of the Parking and Traffic Regulations and subject to a parking citation.

All students are <u>required</u> to maintain a valid University ID. Student IDs are used to access computer labs, library services, and much more. Student IDs are issued at the switchboard in Malone Hall

Safety & Security

- Registration Process Students may register online by using Trojan Web Express, or they may follow the same registration procedures for Dothan Campus classes.
- Student Services You will keep your same faculty advisor; however, students may also call 1-800-414-5756 for assistance 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Students may also submit a helpdesk ticket via http://helpdesk.troy.edu for assistance.
- Tuition Rates For the up-to-date tuition rate and fees for online courses, visit http://online.troy.edu. Dothan Campus scholarships cannot be used to pay tuition for TROY Online courses.
- Bookstore TROY Online textbooks may be ordered online or in person from Barnes & Noble. Students receiving federal financial aid may use book vouchers to purchase textbooks. There is a deadline to request a book voucher (see the TROY Online website for published deadlines). The textbook requirements for Dothan Campus and TROY Online courses may differ. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that they are purchasing the correct textbook.

OWLS Scholarship

The Older, Wiser Learner's Scholarship (OWLS) allows qualified adult students who have not attended a high school, a college, or a university for at least three calendar years to enroll for one 3-hour undergraduate or graduate course offered on the Dothan Campus or Fort Rucker location (TROY Online courses are not eligible). The OWLS Scholarship does not cover the cost of books, supplies, fees, or any other expenses. The recipient must use the OWLS Scholarship the first term upon returning to school. OWLS Scholarships will be available to individuals only once.

Scholarship Opportunities

The deadline to apply for the OWLS Scholarship the **first day of classes for the Term/Semester.** Receiving the OWLS Scholarship is not automatic. All applications must be approved by the first day of classes. **No reimbursement of tuition will be made**. Funding for the OWLS Scholarship is limited. Electronic Resources

Trojan Web Express

Go to Trojan Web Express (http://splash.troy.edu/go-to/webexpress) If you do not know your username, click on "Account Information" at the bottom of the page, then click on "What's my User ID?" Follow the on-screen prompts to obtain your username. Your username is the same as your Trojan Webmail username (minus @troy.edu). Your initial password is set to the First initial (capital) + Last initial (lowercase) + 8 digit birthdate (MMDDYYYY). Immediately after logging in you will be prompted to change your password. It must be 6-9 characters with BOTH letters and numbers.

NOTE: Guest users may use Trojan Web Express to view the schedule of classes. Click on "Students" and then "Search for Sections" and specify a location, term, and academic level.

Trojan Webmail

Visit https://mail.troy.edu. You will not have access to Trojan Webmail for up to 48 hours after your first registration at TROY. Your username and password will be the same as your username for Trojan Web Express username and password.

All Troy University students are required to have and check their Troy University email account. This account should be used for all official Troy University electronic correspondence. Once you have registered for classes your email account will be created within 48 hours. Follow the instructions for your email address and password.

A student's university email address is the official point of communication for all university business conducted with the student. See Troy University ePolicy, Section 426 (http://www.troy.edu/epolicy/manuals/400.htm#426).

Blackboard

To access Blackboard, visit http://splash.troy.edu/go-to/blackboard/. You must be a registered student in a class that uses Blackboard to access Blackboard; you will have access to Blackboard by the first day of classes.

Your username and password for Blackboard is the same as your Trojan Webmail and Trojan Web Express username and password.







Disability Services











Who we are

The Disability Services Office provides accommodations to students with physical, psychological and learning disabilities in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

Student Responsibility

While Section 504 and the ADA require postsecondary institutions to provide accommodative services to students with disabilities, once the student has been admitted to the University, it is the student's responsibility to self-identify and provide documentation of the disability. The University will not provide accommodations until the student (1) comes by The Disability Services Office and requests services, **and** (2) provides recent documentation of his or her disability by a qualified professional.
