- 2.0 High School GPA •20 ACT or 1030 RSAT (950 SAT-1 if taken prior to March 2016)

Freshmen Conditional Admissions Requirements

- 2.5 High School GPA •17-19 ACT or 910 RSAT (830 SAT-1 if taken prior to March 2016)

Transfer Admissions Requirements

- 2.00 GPA on minimum 24 semester hours

Students age 25 or older & Active Duty Military are exempt from ACT/SAT

Financial Aid

How to Apply for Financial Aid?

1. Apply for a Federal Student Aid ID fsaid.ed.gov
A FSA ID is comprised of a username and password and can be used to login to certain Federal Student Aid websites, such as the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
2. Complete the FAFSA www.fafsa.ed.gov
Applicants must have filed their current taxes in order to complete the FAFSA application. Applications submitted electronically are processed in a much shorter time-period than those submitted by mail. Your PIN is required for electronic filing. **Troy University's school code is 001047.** It is recommended that you utilize the IRS Data Retrieval tool in order to ensure your income information is appropriately entered into the FAFSA.
3. Complete the Required Institutional Information www.forms.troy.edu/faid/index
In some instances, more documentation may be required. You can track your financial aid status through Trojan Web Express. Look under "My Documents" for a complete list of required documentation.

Payment

Payment of fees may be made online with Trojan Web Express or at Student Financial Services. Troy University accepts Visa, Master Card, Discover, American Express, money orders, checks, and cash.

Term payment due dates fall around the fourth week of class. Student accounts with a remaining balance after the payment due date are charged a \$50 late fee. Failure to satisfy financial obligations to the University will result in having a restriction placed on future class registrations, possible having the account assigned to a collection agency, and non-release of transcripts and diploma.

Also note, a current semester or term debt must be paid-in-full before a student will be allowed to register during registration dates that occur prior to the payment due date.

Past Due Accounts

All financial or other obligations to the University must be cleared prior to the end of each semester or term. An outstanding balance for a prior semester or term must be paid before the student will be allowed to register for subsequent semesters or terms. Failure to satisfy financial obligations to the University will result in having a restriction placed on future class registrations, transcripts, and/or diploma.

Delinquent student accounts may be reported to a credit bureau and referred to collection agencies or litigated. Students will agree to pay any and all costs associated with collection of unpaid fees including any/all collection agency fees (33.33%), attorney fees, and/or court costs, if such be necessary.

Refund Policy

To receive your refund from Troy, you must activate your refund preference with BankMobile. Be on the lookout for your BankMobile Personal Code for refund selection. You can receive your personal code to the mailing address that you have on file with Troy or to your Trojan email account. Once it arrives, simply follow these steps to make your refund preference selection:

1. Visit [Refundselection.com](https://www.bankmobile.com/refundselection)
2. Enter your personal code
3. Select how you want your money delivered

Your options for receiving your refunds are:

Deposit to an existing account

Money is transferred to an existing account the same business day BankMobile receives funds from Troy. Typically, it takes 1-2 business days for the receiving bank to credit the money to your account.

Deposit to a BankMobile Vibe Checking Account

If you open a BankMobile Vibe checking account (upon identity verification), money is deposited the same business day BankMobile receives funds from Troy.

Registration Procedures:

1. Remove all holds which will prevent your registration (Business Office, Advisor Approval, etc).
2. In consultation with your academic advisor, plan your schedule and register for classes via Student Planning.
3. If you are unable to register through Student Planning please go to the Records Office, Malone Hall, Room 119.
4. Check with the Student Financial Services/Financial Aid Office regarding your balance.

Visit the Admissions Office if you are a new student (not admitted), a returning student who has been out 1 or more years, a returning student who has attended another institution, or a returning student who has already graduated from Troy University.

Graduation Application

All students must complete a Graduation Application prior to graduating from Troy University. Graduation application deadlines are located on page 3 and online at <https://my.troy.edu/records/graduation/intent.html>.

There is a \$60 filing fee that will be billed to the students account 10 business days after filing a graduation application form. If this fee and any other monies owed to Troy University are not paid prior to graduation, your diploma and transcript will be held until the balance is paid.

Student Planning Registration

1. From **my.troy.edu**, click on **Self-Service** and then **Student Planning**.
2. Find "**Search for courses...**" at the top of the screen and type the first course on your registration sheet (ex. MTH 1112).
3. Look for your **course number**, without spaces, (ex: MTH 1112), and then click **Add Course to Plan**. Select the semester or term from the dropdown list, and click **Add Course to Plan** again.
4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each course on you need to register for.
5. Select **Student Planning** and click **Plan & Schedule**. Use arrows (< >) to navigate to the semester or term.
6. Click View other sections under your first course. Find a section that fits in your schedule, click on that yellow course block, and then click **Add Section**. There may be multiple pages of course section options. The section must be **YELLOW**, not **RED** (red courses are full/closed).
7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 for each course on your plan.
8. Click **Register Now** in the upper right corner of the screen.
9. Click **OK** to accept the terms.
10. All courses should turn **GREEN** and you will have completed your registration. If any remain **yellow**, contact your advisor or the Records office.

Testing Services

The Testing Lab is available to students who need to take the ACCUPLACER exam placement test to determine the appropriate level in Math and English. This exam is usually taken during the designated registration days or by appointment. The MAT, DSST, ACT, CLEP, MAPP, and other proctored exams are also administered through the Testing Lab located in Malone Hall, room 111.

Who we are?

The Disability Services Office provides accommodations to students with physical, psychological and learning disabilities in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

Student Responsibility

While Section 504 and the ADA require postsecondary institutions to provide accommodative services to students with disabilities, once the student has been admitted to the University, it is the student's responsibility to self-identify and provide documentation of the disability. The University will not provide accommodations until the student (1) comes by The Disability Services Office and requests services, and (2) provides recent documentation of his or her disability by a qualified professional.

Examples of what we can do for you

- Determine reasonable and appropriate accommodations according to the documented disability. Accommodation letters are provided to each instructor; it only includes the appropriate accommodations. We will never disclose your medical diagnosis.
- Assist students in procuring adaptive technology and equipment as required.
- Assist with the registration process, paying particular attention to areas of academic strength and weakness, so as to not overload or overwhelm the student.

Parking Decal & Student ID Cards

Parking decals are available at the switchboard in Malone Hall. University parking regulations require all students to register their vehicle with the University. To be valid, the permit must be mounted (taping is not permitted) in the lower left corner of the vehicle's rear glass. Any student driving or parking on campus without a permit will be in violation of the Parking and Traffic Regulations and subject to a parking citation.

All students are required to maintain a valid University ID. Student ID's are used to access computer labs, library services, and much more. Student ID's are issued at the switchboard in Malone Hall.

- Registration Process - Students may register online by using Trojan Web Express, or they may follow the same registration procedures for Dothan Campus classes.
- Student Services - You will keep your same faculty advisor; however, students may also call 1-800-414-5756 for assistance 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Students may also submit a helpdesk ticket via <http://helpdesk.troy.edu> for assistance.
- Tuition Rates - For the up-to-date tuition rate and fees for online courses, visit <http://online.troy.edu>. **Dothan Campus scholarships cannot be used to pay tuition for TROY Online courses.**
- Bookstore - TROY Online textbooks may be ordered online or in person from Barnes & Noble. If a student has been awarded financial aid through the Office of Financial Aid and has approved excess funds after all tuition, fees, meals and housing have been paid, the student may charge required books and approved supplies, not to exceed the amount of excess financial aid, up to \$1200. The last day to charge books is the last day of free drop/add (see the TROY Online website for published deadlines). **The textbook requirements for Dothan Campus and TROY Online may differ. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that they are purchasing the correct textbook.**

Trojan Web Express

Go to Trojan Web Express (<http://splash.troy.edu/go-to/webexpress>). If you do not know your username, click on "Account Information" at the bottom of the page, then click on "What's my User ID?" Follow the on-screen prompts to obtain your username. Your username is the same as your Trojan Webmail username (minus @troy.edu). Your initial password is set to the First initial (capital) + Last initial (lowercase) + 8-digit birthdate (MMDDYYYY). Immediately after logging in you will be prompted to change your password. It must be 6-9 characters with BOTH letters and numbers.

NOTE: Guest users may use Trojan Web Express to view the schedule of classes. Click on "Students" and then "Search for Sections" and specify a location, term, and academic level.

Canvas

To access Canvas, visit <http://canvas.troy.edu> You will log into Canvas using your Trojan Web Express Account. If you need help, click on "Get Help" in the Canvas website menu bar for assistance. Allow 4 hours after you register for access to Canvas.

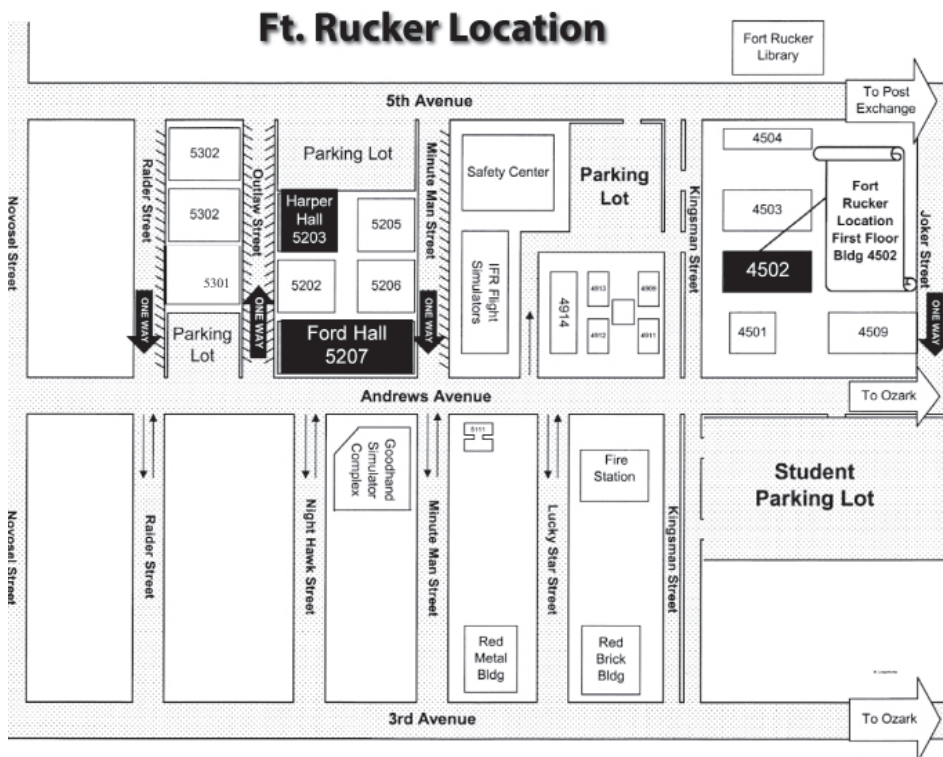
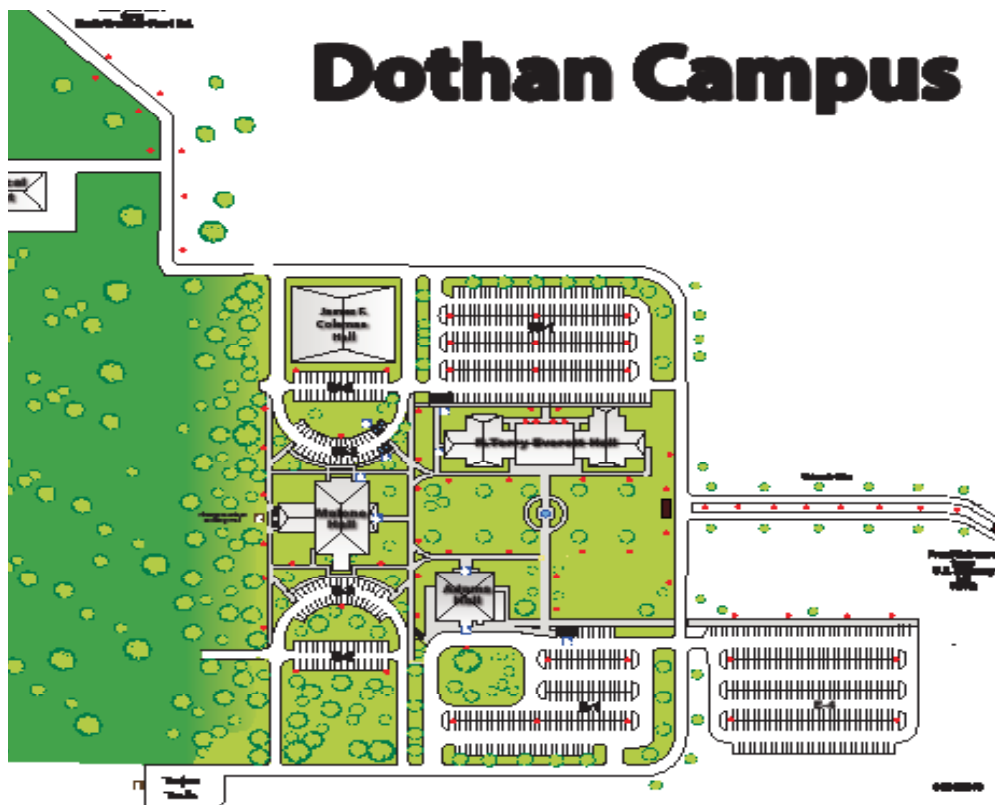

Email

A TROY University email will be assigned to new students 24-48 hours after registration. Students email is the same as their Trojan Web Express ID.

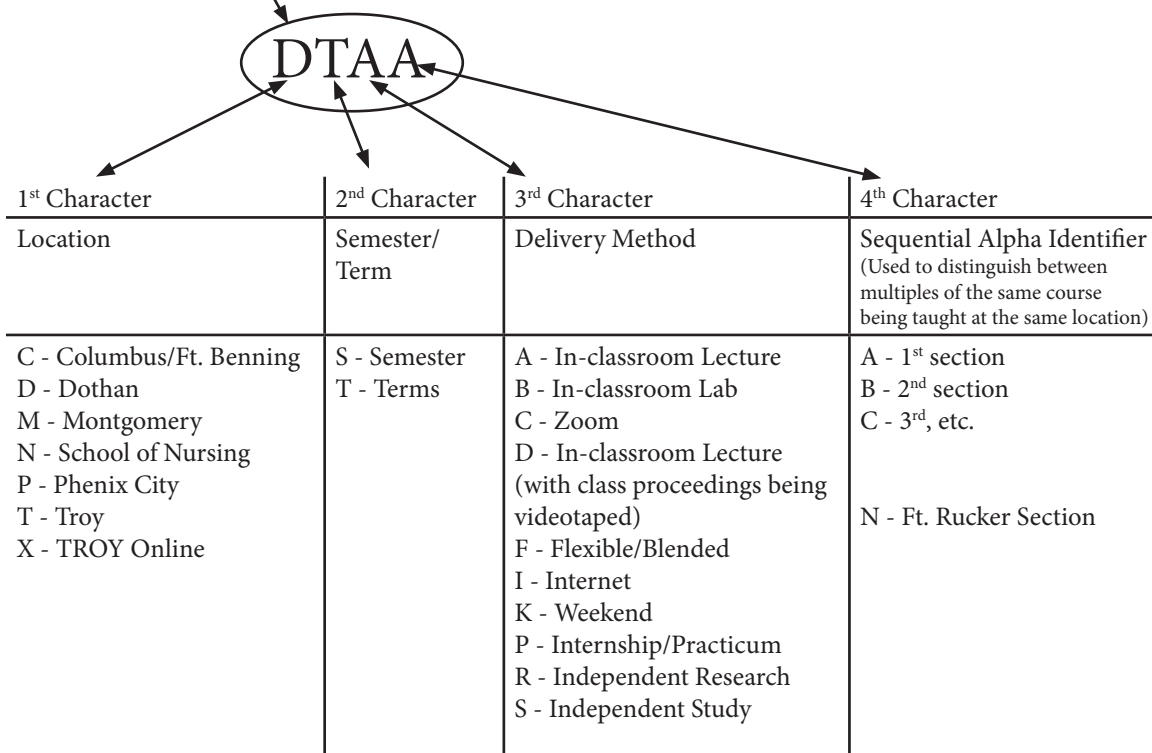

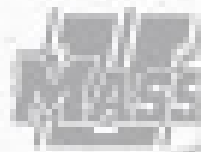

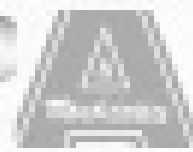
