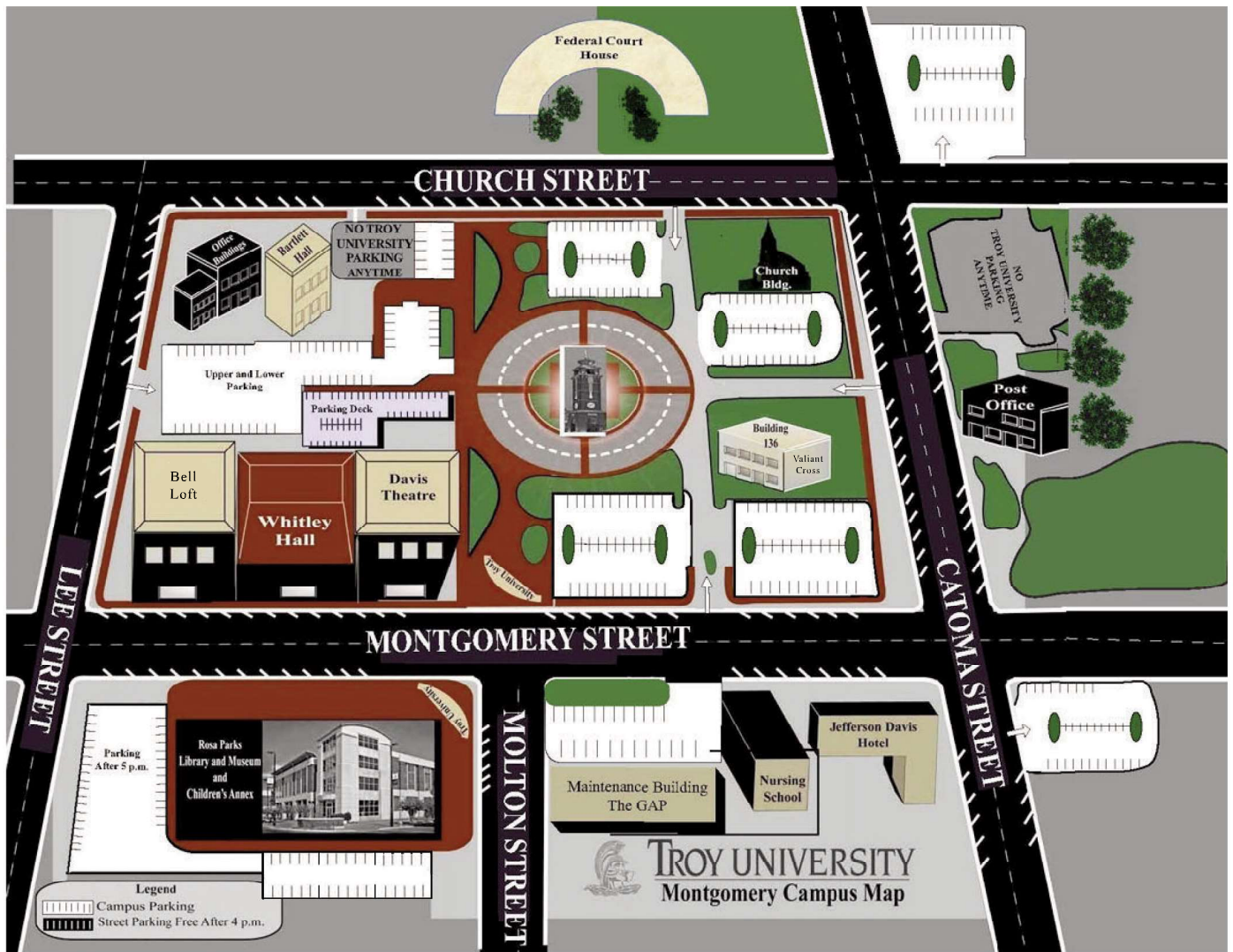

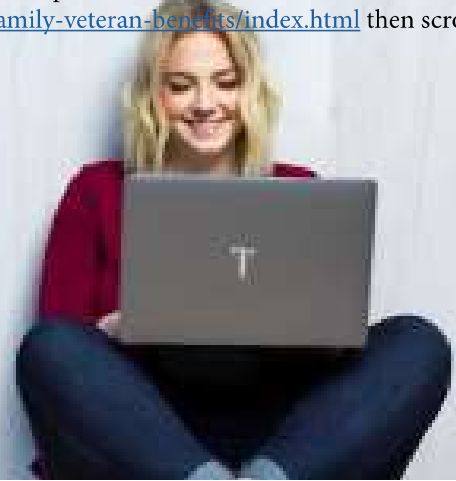

Tuition Procedures

It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that all tuition and fees are paid. Financial Aid recipients are responsible for the balance of tuition and fees not paid by their award. Past due indebtedness will be submitted to a collection agency. Additional collection fees will be added to the indebted account.

Notice: You may not enroll for future terms/semesters if you are indebted to the University. The current term/semester must be paid-in-full at the time of registration.

Payments

Payment of fees may be made online with Trojan Web Express or at Student Financial Services. Troy University accepts Visa, Master Card, Discover, American Express, money orders, checks, and cash.

Term payment due dates fall around the fourth week of class. Student accounts with a remaining balance after the payment due date are charged a \$50 late fee. Failure to satisfy financial obligations to the University will result in having a restriction placed on future class registrations, possible having the account assigned to a collection agency, and non-release of transcripts and diploma.

Also note, a current semester or term debt must be paid-in-full before a student will be allowed to register during registration dates that occur prior to the payment due date.

Past Due Accounts

All financial or other obligations to the University must be cleared prior to the end of each semester or term. An outstanding balance for a prior semester or term must be paid before the student will be allowed to register for subsequent semesters or terms. Failure to satisfy financial obligations to the University will result in having a restriction placed on future class registrations, transcripts, and/or diploma.

Delinquent student accounts may be reported to a credit bureau and referred to collection agencies or litigated. Students will agree to pay any and all costs associated with collection of unpaid fees including any/all collection agency fees (33.33%), attorney fees, and/or court costs, if such be necessary.

Montgomery Campus Cafe Dollars

All students registering for a 1-hour course at the Montgomery Campus, taking undergraduate, graduate, doctoral or post-graduate credit hours on campus will automatically be charged the \$25 Montgomery Café Dollars plan per term. These dollars may be used at the Barnes & Noble Café on the Montgomery Campus to purchase food, drink, clothing, trade books, cap & gown and convenience items only. Montgomery Café Dollars may not be used to purchase textbooks. These dollars will be available on the day after the last date to add a course and must be utilized by the last day of the term.

Any unused dollars are forfeited. There are no exceptions to this requirement.

BankMobile

To receive your refund from Troy, you must activate your refund preference with BankMobile. Be on the lookout for your BankMobile Personal Code for refund selection. You can receive your personal code to the mailing address that you have on file with Troy or to your Trojan email account. Once it arrives, simply follow these steps to make your refund preference selection:

1. Visit Refundselection.com
2. Enter your personal code
3. Select how you want your money delivered

Your options for receiving your refunds are:

Deposit to an existing account

Money is transferred to an existing account the same business day BankMobile receives funds from Troy. Typically, it takes 1-2 business days for the receiving bank to credit the money to your account.

Deposit to a BankMobile Vibe Checking Account

If you open a BankMobile Vibe checking account (upon identity verification), money is deposited the same business day BankMobile receives funds from Troy.

Refunds

Any student who registers for classes will be responsible for tuition and fees regardless of class attendance. Refunds to financial aid students are not made until after the financial aid funds have been received by the University. Fees are non-refundable. Tuition refunds will be granted according to the following schedule:

*Registration (online and on-campus) continues until the last day to drop/add for the Term or Semester

Registration Procedures:

1. Remove all holds which will prevent your registration (Business Office, Advisor Approval, etc).
2. In consultation with your academic advisor, plan your schedule and register for classes via Student Planning.
3. If you are unable to register through Student Planning please go to the Records Office, room 208, Whitley Hall. Nursing students go to the School of Nursing.
4. Check with the Student Financial Services/Financial Aid Office regarding your balance.

Visit the Admissions Office if you are a new student (not admitted), a returning student who has been out 2 or more years, a returning student who has attended another institution, or a returning student who has already graduated from Troy University.

Prerequisites

Prerequisite requirements are listed in the Undergraduate and Graduate Catalogs. It is the student's responsibility to fulfill all prerequisites. All applicable fees will be charged to the student for schedule changes resulting from failure to meet prerequisite requirements

Adding a Course

Courses can be added to your schedule any time during registration and FREE schedule adjustment. Students may NOT add a course after the FREE schedule adjustment period.

Student Planning Registration

1. Navigate to my.troy.edu. If you already know your user ID and password, continue to “b.”
 - a. Select Students and then click on “What’s my TrojanPass ID?” Enter our last name and SSN or ID number, click submit, and write down our user ID.
 - b. Navigate to <https://login.microsoft.com>.
 - c. Enter your user ID + @troy.edu (for example, jdoe12345@troy.edu)
 - d. If you have already logged in before, enter our password. If you have not yet logged in, your initial password is as follows: first letter of your last name (lowercase), and your 8 digit birth date (mmddyyyy Ex. Ab01231999).
 - e. You must change your password and you will be prompted for additional information (alternate email address and security questions). Please follow the guidelines on the screen.
2. Once you have finished the login process, navigate to my.troy.edu.
3. Scroll down and click Self-Service on the 3rd row of boxes and then Student Planning.
4. Find “Search for courses…” at the top of the screen and type the first course for which you would like to register with no spaces (ex. MTH 1112).
5. Look for your course number (ex: MTH 1112), and then click Add Course to Plan. Select term or semester from the drop-down list, and click Add Course to Plan again.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 for each course for which you would like to register.
7. Click Student Planning at the top of the page and then click Plan & Schedule. Use the arrows (< >) to navigate to semester or term.
8. Click View other sections under your first course. Find a section that fits in your schedule, click on that yellow course block, and then click Add Section. There may be multiple pages of course section options. The section must be **YELLOW**, not **RED** (red courses are full/closed).
9. Repeat steps 7 and 8 for each course on your plan.
10. Click Register Now in the upper right corner of the screen. Click OK to accept the terms.
11. All courses should turn **GREEN** and you will have completed your registration. If any remain **yellow**, contact your advisor or the Records office.

Dropping a Course During Free Schedule Adjustment

- Students are not charged tuition or fees during this period
- Use Student Planning or go to the University Records Office, Whitley Hall, room 208

Dropping a Course After Free Schedule Adjustment

- Students will owe a \$30 drop fee and full tuition
- Use Student Planning or go to University Registrar's Office, Whitley Hall, room 208

Withdrawing During Free Schedule Adjustment

- Students are not charged tuition or fees during this period
- Must complete the online withdrawal form by going to <https://etroy.troy.edu/forms/eWithdrawForm.aspx?levelid=GR>

Withdrawing After Free Schedule Adjustment

- Students will owe a \$50 withdrawal fee and full tuition
- Must complete the online withdrawal form by going to <https://etroy.troy.edu/forms/eWithdrawForm.aspx?levelid=GR>

To drop ALL courses, students will need to complete a withdrawal form by going to <https://etroy.troy.edu/forms/eWithdrawForm.aspx?levelid=GR> or in person at the Campus Registrar/Records Office, Whitley Hall, Room 208.

Students dropping or withdrawing a course(s) after free schedule adjustment will not be penalized academically; however full tuition and fees will apply.

WITHDRAWALS FOR STUDENTS RECEIVING TITLE IV AID

If a recipient of Title IV Aid withdraws during the term/semester, the university will calculate the amount of aid the student did not earn, and the unearned portion will be returned to the Title IV programs. The student is responsible for any charges which are unpaid as a result of the return of the Title IV funds.

Testing Services

Placement Testing

Students enrolling in ENG 1100, ENG 1101, MTH 1100, MTH 1105, MTH 1110, or MTH 1112 must have completed any required placement tests or be enrolled in the appropriate prerequisite course or have successfully completed the prerequisite course with a “C” or better or you will not be able to register for the course.

Students who have an ACT English (ACT-E) score of 20 or higher are not required to take the ACCUPLACER English placement test for ENG 1101, unless the ACT is over 3 years old.

ACT Residual Testing

ACT Residual Test fee is \$55 and can be paid in the Student Financial Services Office, Whitley Hall, Room 216.

ACT Residual Test scores are only valid for Troy University sites.

Students with Disabilities

Who we are?

The Disability Services Office provides accommodations to students with physical, psychological and learning disabilities in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

Student Responsibility

While Section 504 and the ADA require postsecondary institutions to provide accommodative services to students with disabilities, once the student has been admitted to the University, it is the student's responsibility to self-identify and provide documentation of the disability. The University will not provide accommodations until the student (1) comes by The Disability Services Office and requests services, and (2) provides recent documentation of his or her disability by a qualified professional.

Examples of what we can do for you

- Determine reasonable and appropriate accommodations according to the documented disability. Accommodation letters are provided to each instructor; it only includes the appropriate accommodations. We will never disclose your medical diagnosis.
- Assist students in procuring adaptive technology and equipment as required.
- Assist with the registration process, paying particular attention to areas of academic strength and weakness, so as to not overload or overwhelm the student.

Students save up to 50% on textbooks by renting from the Montgomery Campus bookstore.



NOTE: The textbook requirements for the Alabama Campuses (Dothan, Montgomery, Phenix City, and Troy), Global Campus, and TROY Online may differ. It is the student's responsibility to ensure the correct textbook is purchased.

Student ID Cards

ID cards are mandatory for all students. Student ID cards are required to check out library books, to park on campus property, and for bookstore charges. Students can receive their ID cards at the Whitley Hall Information Desk, Monday – Thursday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 3 p.m. (students must show proof of class registration).

Student ID cards are lifetime cards and should not be destroyed. A replacement fee of \$15 will be charged for student ID cards.

Swipe access fobs are required for access to the School of Nursing building and the Whitley Hall student computer lab (room 610). Access fobs can also be obtained at the Whitley Hall Information Desk and must be reactivated each term/semester. A replacement fee of \$15 will be charged for lost access fobs.

Trojan Web Express

Go to Trojan Web Express (<http://splash.troy.edu/go-to/webexpress>). If you do not know your username, click on “Account Information” at the bottom of the page, then click on “What’s my User ID?” Follow the on-screen prompts to obtain your username. Your username is the same as your Trojan Webmail username (minus @troy.edu). Your initial password is set to the First initial (capital) + Last initial (lowercase) + 8-digit birthdate (MMDDYYYY). Immediately after logging in you will be prompted to change your password. It must be 6-9 characters with BOTH letters and numbers.

NOTE: Guest users may use Trojan Web Express to view the schedule of classes. Click on “Students” and then “Search for Sections” and specify a location, term, and academic level.

Parking decals expire at the end of each summer term/semester. New Parking decals will be available at the beginning of each fall term/semester. To avoid parking fines or towing at owners expense, please park in authorized spaces and have a current parking permit displayed on the outside of your drivers’ side rear window.

Children on Campus

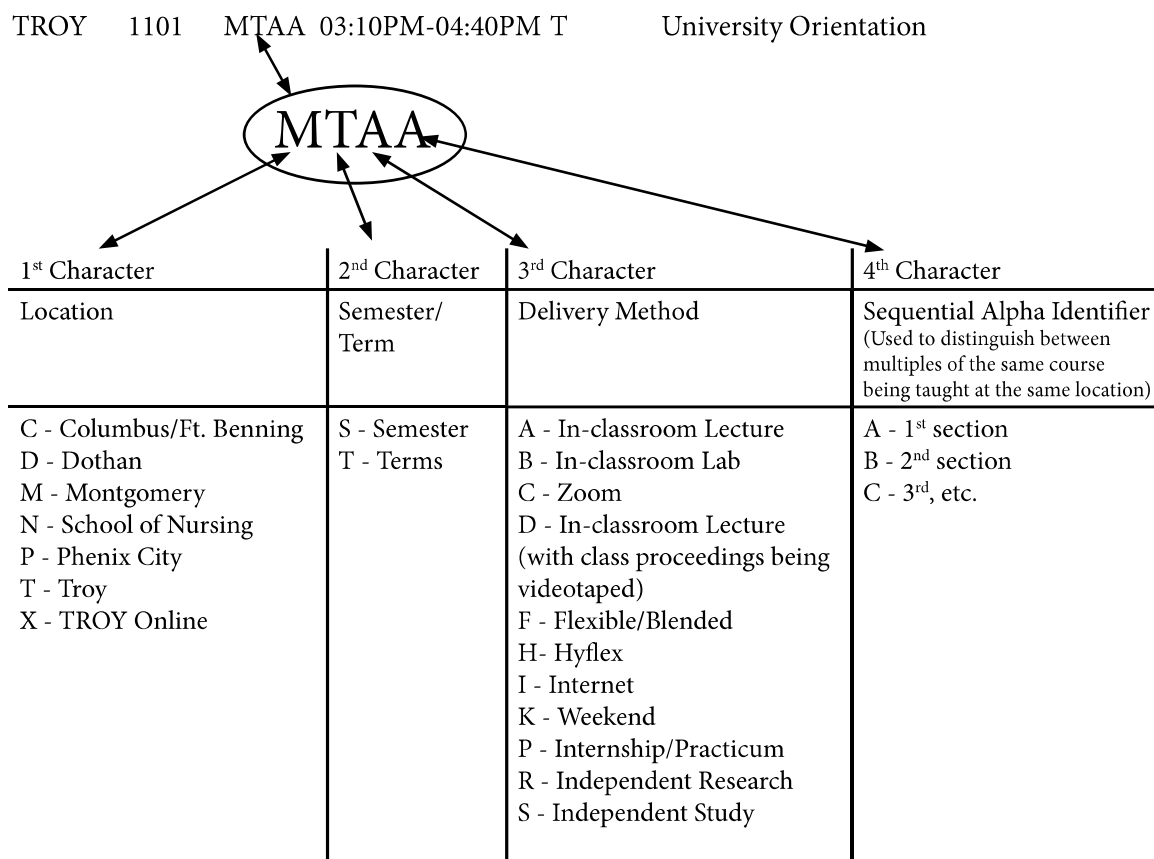
Troy University policy requires that all children on campus be accompanied by an adult at all times. For safety and security reasons, a child not accompanied by an adult while on campus will be treated as a lost child. All personnel, including students, are prohibited from bringing children and leaving them unattended at any location. If an unaccompanied child is observed, the first priority will be to locate the parent or guardian and return the lost child to their custody immediately.
